## Exodus 17 v 15

- If you go into a cath\_\_\_\_\_ you may see, hanging up, the faded and tattered fl\_\_\_\_ that were once carried into battle.
- 2. Sometimes they have the names of the battles embroidered on them, such as *Inkerman, Lucknow* or *El Alamein*.
- 3. Flags or banners are im\_\_\_\_\_ because of what they represent.
- Our flag, the Union J\_\_\_\_, is just a piece of coloured cloth, but it stands for our country. It is made up of the cross of St G\_\_\_\_\_ (England), St P\_\_\_\_ (Ireland) and St A\_\_\_\_\_ (Scotland).
- 5. There is no reference to W\_\_\_\_\_, because Wales was incorporated into England in 1606 when the flag was first designed.
- 6. The flag speaks of union, a union of Christian nations.
- 7. When the Israelites spoke of the Lord as their 'banner', they meant that the Lord was their k\_\_\_ and leader.
- 8. It is the duty of a s\_\_\_\_\_, or a citizen to follow the flag and a Christian must follow Christ.
- 9. A soldier must be l\_\_\_\_ to the flag, and a Christian should be loyal to Christ.
- 10. A soldier must not be ashamed of his flag, and a Christian must not be ashamed of Christ.
