

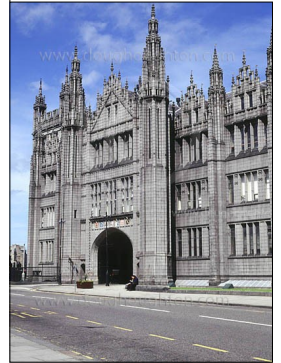
# 'STABILITY'
