14. George Grenfell - Missionary to the Congo



1. George Grenfell was born in Sancreed, near Penzance, C_____ in 1849, but grew up in Birmingham.
2. Later, like Livingstone, he became a missionary and pioneer-explorer in A_____. Also like Livingstone, he had a s____. It was called 'Peace' and was brought out from England in p____ and assembled by Grenfell himself.
3. The ship was loaded with 500 brass rods. This was used for money in the C_____. No Bibles were loaded because there were none in the language of these people; part of Grenfell's work was to translate the B_____.
4. As 'Peace' went up the river, Mrs Grenfell waved them off with a smile, but inside she was very anxious, for there were many dangers ahead. The dangers were from rocks, sandbanks, hippopotami, fever-breeding m_____, and worst of all, poison-a_____ and sp_____.
5. Further on, the river was 2 miles wide, and infested with cr_____.
6. Eventually, they came to the place where they planned to build the first mission-st_____. The chief's w____ had died, and all the people were drunk. 4 slaves were to be sacrificed to the false gods of the village.
