1. If you had lived 150 years ago, you would have known what 'the stocks' were. Every t\_\_\_\_ or v\_\_\_\_\_ had 'the stocks'.
2. Stocks were for putting p\_\_\_\_\_ in who had committed minor crimes.
3. In New England you would have been put in the stocks for br\_\_\_\_\_ the Sabbath.
4. The stocks were not a very comfortable or pleasant way of p\_\_\_\_\_ people.

5. In the text it says that Job was put 'in the stocks'.... but he had not done anything wr\_\_\_\_. It meant that God had hemmed him in - keeping J\_\_ from doing something that he w\_\_\_\_\_ to do.
6. Sometimes we are stopped from doing things we would like to do, but usually we are stopped because those things in the e\_\_ would not be g\_\_\_ for us.
