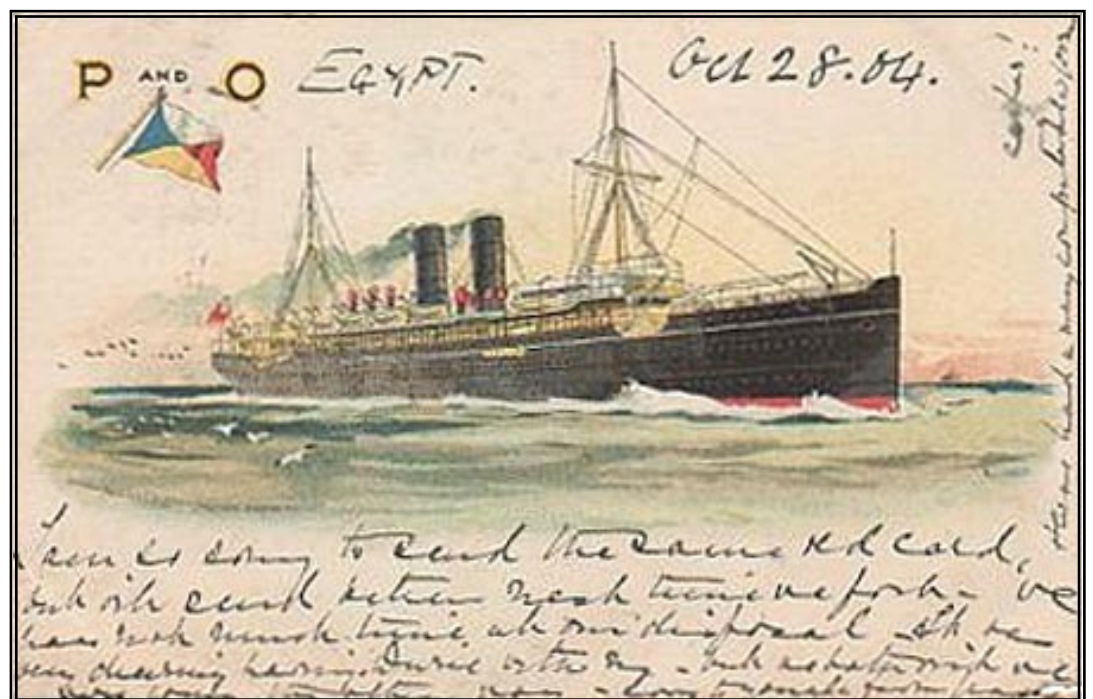
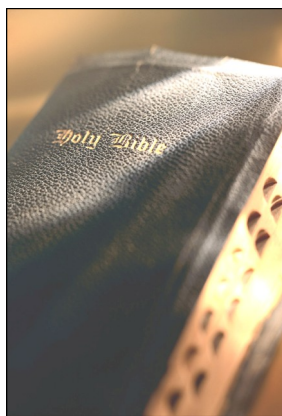


TREASURES ON THE DEEP

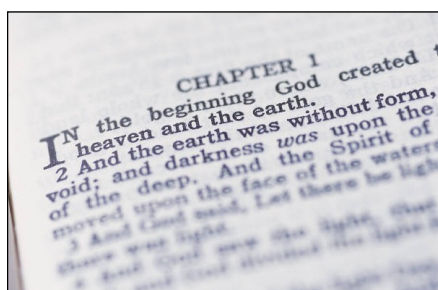
Precious treasure, thou art mine:
